#### Main Street Saskatchewan

The Main Street Saskatchewan Grant Program (MSSGP) supports the implementation of the Government of Saskatchewan's Main Street Saskatchewan program by providing funds to local Main Street organizations and property owners for community organization, economic restructuring, marketing, heritage conservation and design projects. The MSSGP is administered by SaskCulture Inc. on behalf of the Government of Saskatchewan. There are two different levels of grant funding available for Main Street communities. The first level is a Heritage Conservation Grant. This provides funding up to \$20,000 in a matching grant to buildings that are 40 years of age or older. The second level is a Community Enhancement Grant. This provides funding up to \$10,000 in a matching grant for all projects on Main Street including but not limited to: sidewalks, street furniture, landscaping, wayfinding signs and plaques, etc. Contact Brooklyn Orange at brooklyn.orange@nledc.com or 306-883-9494 for more information on the Main Street Saskatchewan Grant Program.

# Parking of Trailers & Campers

Please be mindful of parking of trailers & campers for extended periods of time. There is a bylaw in place which prohibits parking of trailers and campers on any street in Spiritwood for more than 48 consecutive hours. If you are parking your camper off to the side of the street, please be courteous and avoid restricting sightlines for intersections and driveways.

This summer you will notice road repair work being done around town. An asphalt repair company has been employed to repair potholes on Main Street. The Town has also purchased a stockpile of cold mix so that the Town Maintenance Crew will be able to repair other roads throughout town. We ask that drivers be courteous while crews are at work.
