### Grass in your Back Alleys!

It is the responsibility of the home owners to mow all grass on the perimeters of their properties including back alleys.

### Potential Causes of High Water Bills

An unusually high water bill is most often caused by a leak or change in water use. Some common causes of high water bills include: - A leaking toilet, or a toilet that continues to run after being flushed; a dripping faucet; a faucet drip can waste 20 gallons of water a day or more - Filling or topping off a swimming pool - Watering the lawn, new grass, or trees; also check for an open hose bib - Kids home for summer vacations or school holidays; guests - Water-cooled air conditioners - A broken water pipe or obvious leak; check the pipes in the basement or crawlspace; the water heater could also be leaking - Water softener problems – cycles continuously - Running the water to avoid freezing water pipes during cold weather. Generally, water consumption is higher during the summer due to watering of lawns, pools, and gardening.

### Don't Use the Dumpsters

Just a reminder to the town residents that all the blue and red dumpsters located around town are paid for by private businesses and are not for personal use. Please be considerate and use the transfer site if you have extra garbage.

### Illegal Burning

Burning of materials other than clean wood is strictly prohibited. Fines for this activity start at \$1400 but can easily be much more. Clean wood is considered unpainted, untreated lumber; and trees, branches and bushes. The Environmental Management and Protection Act and General Regulations are the applicable legislation. Contact the Ministry of Environment Conservation Officers 306-883-8501 for more information or to report a violation.

### Dogs

We have had numerous complaints that dogs are not being contained to their owner's yard. These dogs are running at large and are defecating in their neighbor's yards. Just a reminder that ALL dogs in town need to be licensed and contained to the owner's property.

Please purchase your dog license from the Town Office. As per Bylaw No. 409/05, every dog owner within the Town of Spiritwood shall register and obtain a dog license tag for all dogs.
