It is mandatory for all pet owners to purchase a license annually for their dog(s) and/or cat(s). If your pet were to get out or lost, this ensures they can easily be returned to you and avoids a fine. The cost is \$25 per animal.

BUSINESS LICENSES

Please contact the Town Office to renew or receive your business license for 2021!

If you do not operate your business from a property classed as commercial or industrial, you need a business licence to operate within the Town of Spiritwood boundaries. If you hire contractors & businesses from outside of town, they are required to have a business license to be able to work. This includes plumbers, builders, electricians, heating technicians, etc.

TRANSFER SITE

The transfer site is open January 2nd & 16th, February 6th & 20th, and March 6th & 20th from 11:00 AM – 4:00 PM. Summer hours resume April 3rd. Visit our website for the 2021 calendar.

UNPAID UTILITIES

Please note that if utility bills remain unpaid, as per *The Municipalities Act*, the amounts will be applied to your property taxes. If the property is occupied by a renter it is the responsibility of the property owner to ensure the utility bills remain current. At this time, we encourage you to pay online. We are registered with major financial institutions such as Scotiabank, Bank of Montreal and Credit Unions!

SNOW REMOVAL

If there is a significant snowfall, please remove vehicles parked on the streets to allow Public Works Staff to pass by with equipment easily. Also, please remove garbage & recycle carts from the streets as soon as possible after it gets picked up. Remember it is the responsibility of the residents and business owners to clear the snow from the sidewalks in front of their property.
